



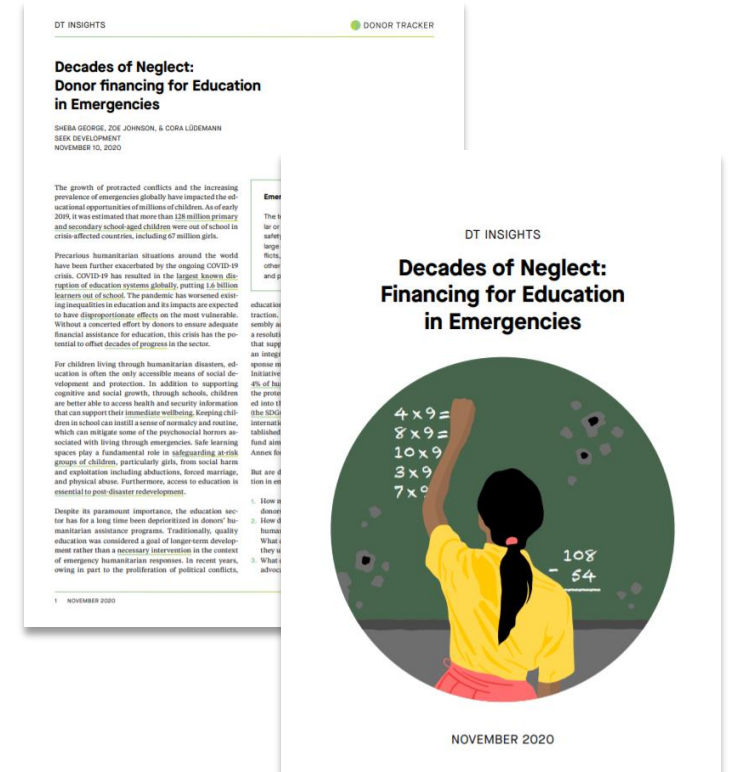

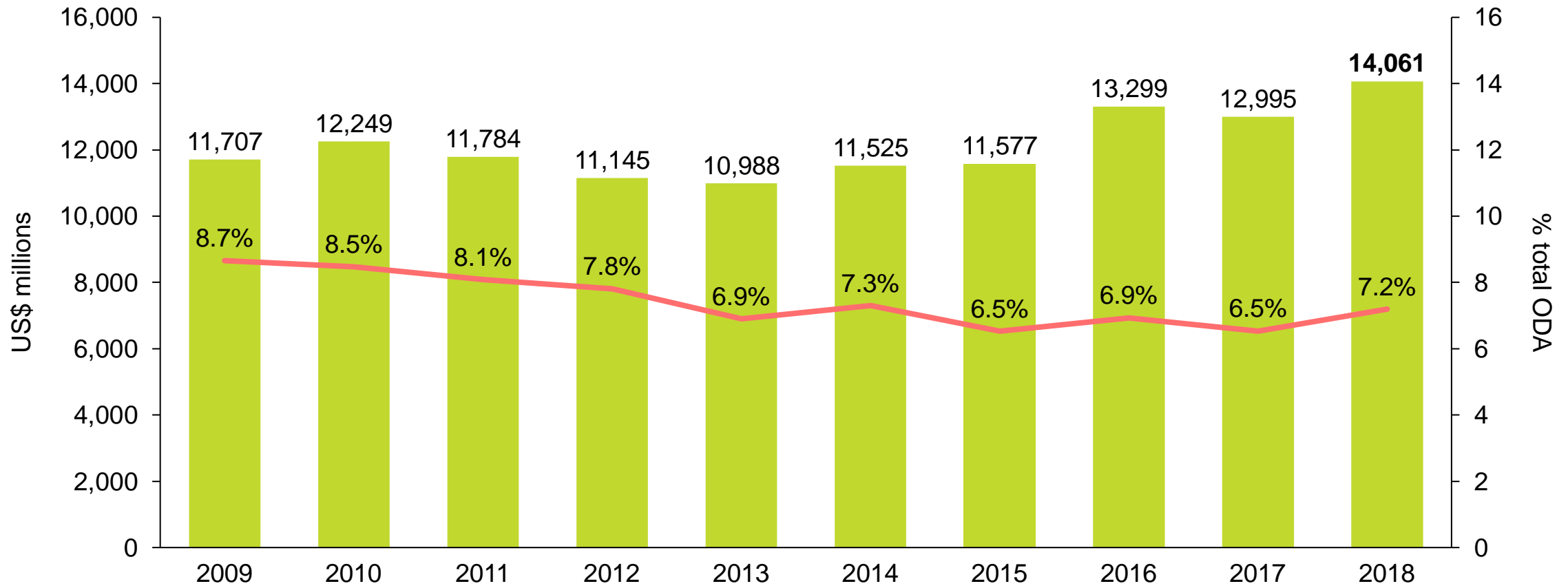

The share of ODA spent on education has remained stagnant since 2013

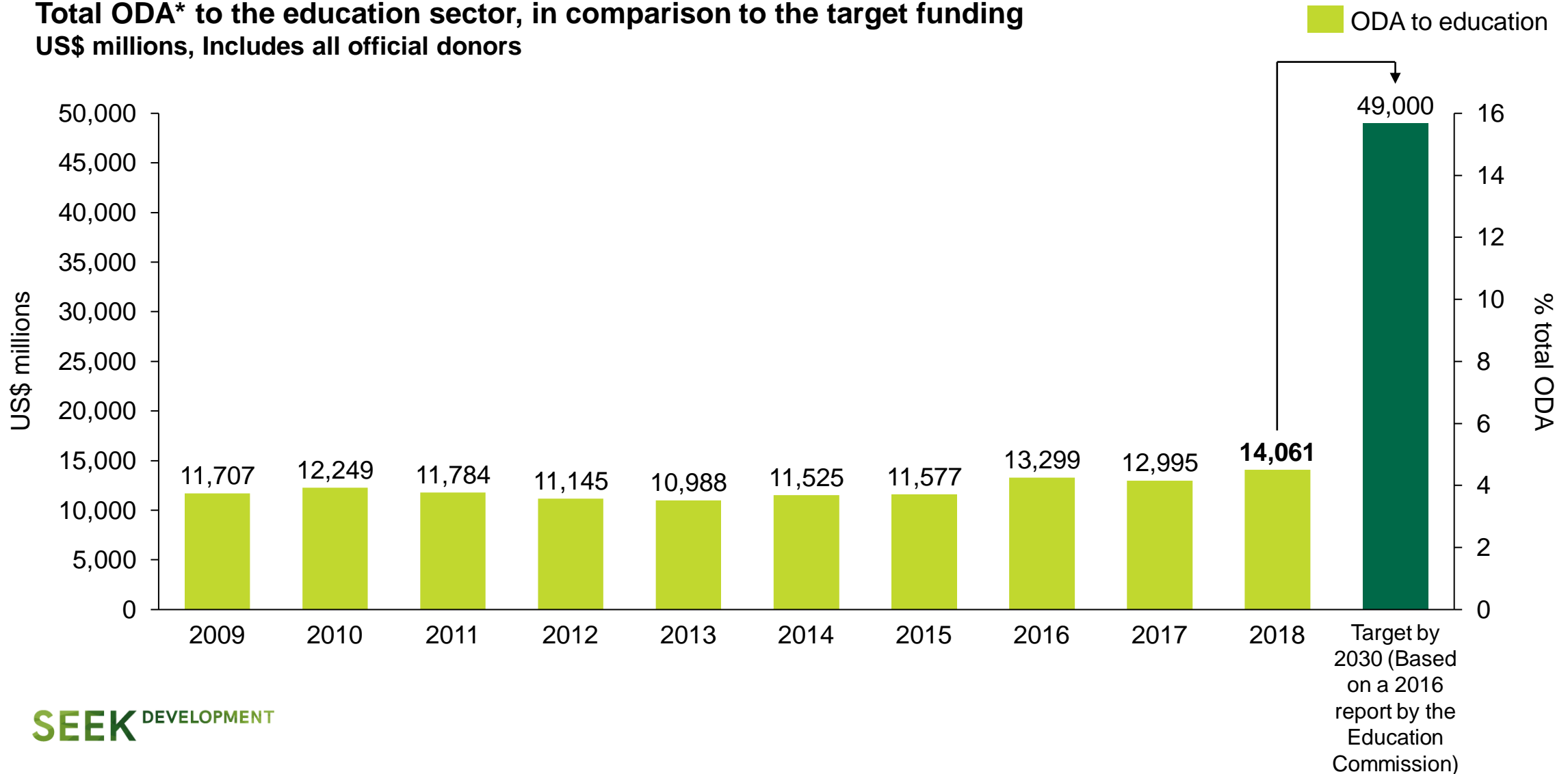
Total ODA* to the education sector, 2009-2018

At least US\$49.0 billion per year by 2030 is needed to fill the funding gap in education

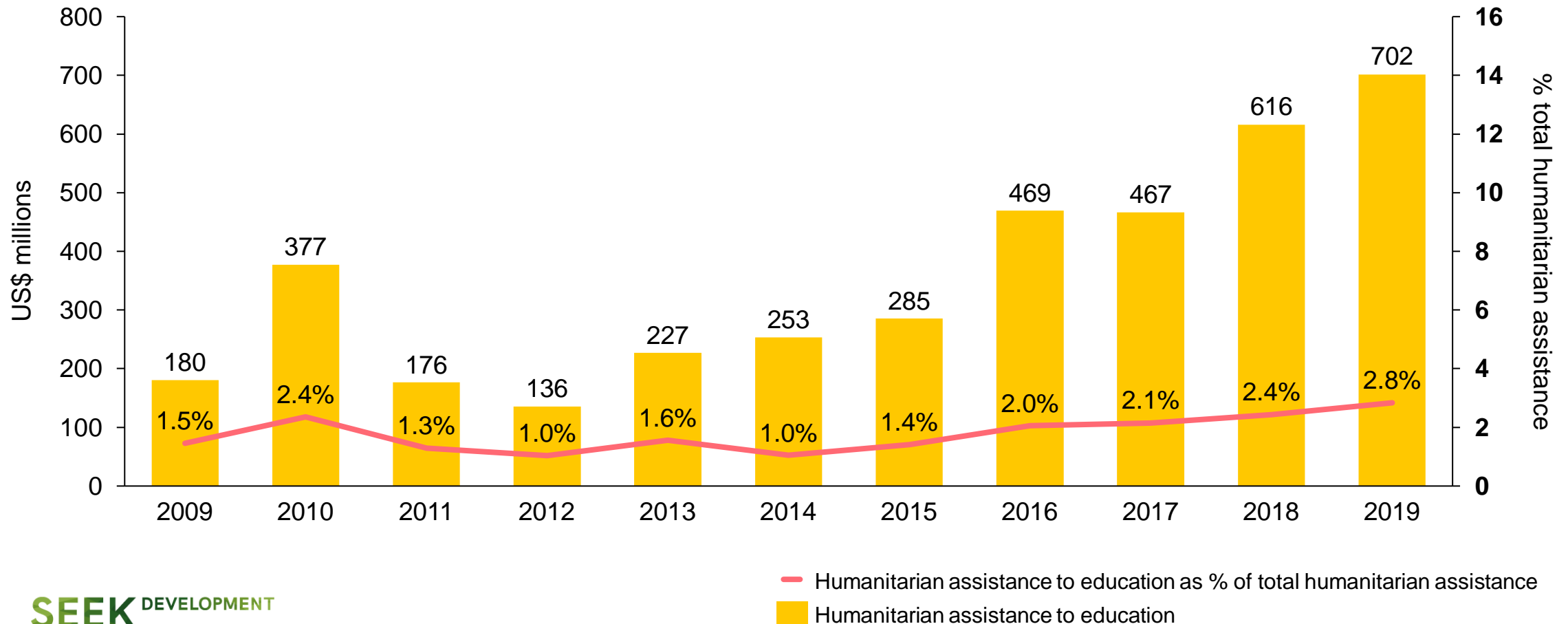
Total ODA* to the education sector, in comparison to the target funding
